## Avishkar - Beyond Atom



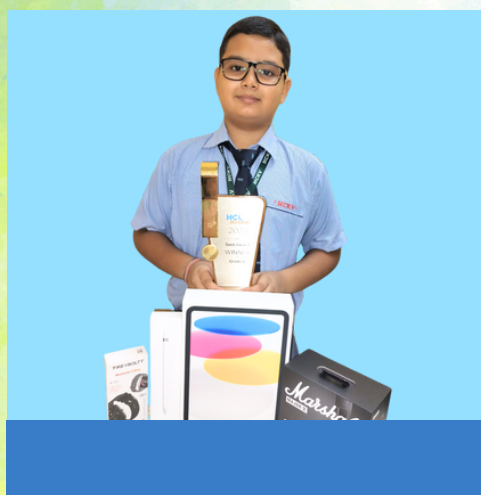

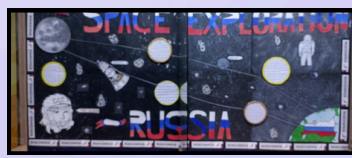
