Experiential Learning amidst Nature: MCKV Students at Madhusthali Vidyapeeth



Students visited *Burhai* and a nearby dam, explored the scenic campus, and engaged in hands-on activities such as gardening, clay modelling, *Warli* art with dried leaves, and the One-Pot Meal cooking session that fostered teamwork, independence, and sustainable thinking.

Skywatching Workshop at MCKV - A Journey into the Cosmos



M. C. Kejriwal Vidyapeeth organised an engaging Skywatching Workshop on 24 November 2025 from 2:30 p.m. to 5:30 p.m., giving students an insightful introduction to observational astronomy. Held in collaboration with Skywatching Workshop, a Registered Space Tutor of ISRO, the session blended hands-on learning with real-time celestial viewing. Students learned how telescopes function, how they support astronomical studies, and safely observed sunspots through solar-protected telescopes. The highlight was viewing the Sun, sunspots, the Moon, Saturn, and other celestial objects through advanced telescopes. Students of Classes 8, 9, and 11 participated enthusiastically. Director Sir, Headmaster Sir and Academic Coordinators attended, and Director Sir announced the upcoming Astronomy Club to inspire future exploration.

Plue is the New Gold: Under the Recognition of International Dimensions in Schools (RIDS)

Interact Club of MCKV - Activities of This Month






