Students completed the challenge successfully and were awarded certificates and medals, making it an enriching experience that fostered a love for reading and creativity.

SDG Awareness Programme under ASISC Initiative (UKG–Class 5)



M. C. Kejriwal Vidyapeeth celebrated Republic Day with a week-long SDG Awareness Programme under the ASISC initiative for UKG to Class 5, blending national values with SDGs on education, gender equality, environment, and social responsibility.

Upper KG explored SDGs 4, 5, and 15 through drawing, role plays, and discussions. Classes 1–2 focussed on SDG 15 with awareness boards, nature walks, and skits. Class 3 highlighted SDG 5 via posters, videos, and “We Are Equal” caps. Class 4 reflected on gender roles through creative posters, and Class 5 prepared placards and delivered JAM talks on education, rights, and inspiring personalities.

The programme promoted awareness, empathy, and responsible citizenship, embodying the spirit of Republic Day.

Activities under the Recognition of International Dimension in Schools (RIDS)

“Break the Bias” Activity: Promoting Gender Equality and Global Awareness



M. C. Kejriwal Vidyapeeth conducted an in-house activity under the Recognition of International Dimension in schools (RIDS) programme. Titled “Break the Bias”, the activity aligned with SDG 5 (Gender Equality) and SDG 10 (Reduced Inequalities). Students explored gender roles and social norms in India, Egypt, Sweden, Saudi Arabia, and Rwanda. Key activities included creating an Equality Tree. They also performed skit “Walking in each other’s shoes” showcasing reversed gender roles and also participated in a debate on “The impact of gender roles on societal progress”. A Model United Nations (MUN) was organised having a committee on United Nations Commission on the Status of Women (UNCSW) which deliberated on the agenda ‘Bridging Gender Equality in Access to Healthcare and Reproductive Rights’. The students also made a flash movie on gender equality. The project enhanced students’ empathy, critical thinking, creativity and global citizenship.

Chemistry for Global Sustainability: Kitchen Chemistry



As part of the RIDS programme, students participated in a range of chemistry-based activities highlighting sustainable practices followed in India, Germany, Sweden, and Japan. The initiative was closely aligned with the UN Sustainable Development Goals—SDG 3 (Good Health and Well-being), SDG 9 (Industry, Innovation and Infrastructure), SDG 12 (Responsible Consumption and Production), and SDG 15 (Life on Land). Students actively contributed by presenting a Green Chemistry skit during the morning assembly, showcasing eco-friendly chemical innovations from the four countries. Through Kitchen Chemistry, they prepared natural cleansers, herbal pesticides, biodegradable materials, and traditional preservation methods, linking chemistry with sustainable living. Creative eco-badges made from recycled materials, student-authored sustainability articles on the school website, and flow charts on biomass utilisation, plastic reduction, and waste management concluded the initiative.

Currency Chronicles: A Global Currency Voyage



As a part of the RIDS project, the four school Houses of M. C. Kejriwal Vidyapeeth participated in an engaging activity titled “Currency Chronicles.” Each house was allotted a country—Ghana, India, Thailand, and Egypt—to decorate their respective house boards to narrate the story of the nation’s currency. The displays focussed on three key aspects: the history of the currency, its journey of evolution, and its exchange rate with respect to the US dollar. The activity blended history, economics, and international awareness, transforming school corridors into a vibrant global learning space.
